CHILDREN AND GRATITUDE



When we think of ways to teach gratitude to children, take a moment to pause and reflect in our day the moments of gratitude: when we said "thank you"; when we showed kindness to others or helped someone in need; the time we donated to charity or gathered food to a food bank. Acts of gratitude can be found in our every day lives. But the question lies: how do children imbibe gratitude and practice it daily?

Young children are natural observers and imitators; the elementary children are truth seekers and change makers.

A starting point would be to surround them with an environment that models behavior of gratitude.

In an article written by Amy Morin, she writes several ways you can model gratitude to children:

- 1. Say "thank you". Whether you thank the clerk at the store or thank your child for clearing the table, make sure you're thanking people.
- Talk about gratitude. Make it a point to share what you are grateful for, even on a rough day, point out that there still a lot to be grateful for.
- 3. Express gratitude. When your child sees you writing a note or sending a token of your appreciation to someone, you will teach them to do the same.

Similar to learning a skill, learning gratitude can take time and practice. Be patient and in time gratitude will be instilled intrinsically.
