# The Peace Table

Young children are still learning how to handle conflict. They may not have the language skills or conflict resolution skills to prevent a disagreement or a fight from happening. Dr. Montessori developed the 3 levels of obedience to help adults understand how children transition from following their instinct to using their judgement during conflicts. Children 0-5 are still drawn to their instinct and around 5-6 they tend to do the right thing, but not all the time. As they grow older and communicate better, they are able to control their emotions and come up with better solutions to resolve a conflict or a problem.

One of the tools for resolving conflict in a Montessori school is the use of the Peace Table.

What is The Peace Table?

"The Peace Table is where students can peaceably resolve their disputes independently or with the limited aid of an adult mediator. It starts at the age of 3-6.

The setup for the Peace Table is simple. A child-sized table, two child-sized chairs, and an object symbolic of peace, such as a dove figurine or olive branch (or peace rose), are the only objects required to create the Peace Table.

During this dispute between two students, the children sit facing one another at the same table. The object symbolic of peace acts as an inanimate mediator. The child who is holding the object speaks uninterrupted. The child who is not holding the object listens silently while the other child tells his side of the story. When the first child is finished telling his perspective, he hands the object to the second child. It is now the second child's turn to listen silently. The object is passed back and forth between the two children until the disagreement between them is resolved. At first, this simple turn-taking system may require help from an adult.

Over time, adult help should become less necessary as students' verbal communication skills and independence blossom. Eventually, all children in the at school should be able to resolve their disagreements independently or with minimal adult guidance."

The Peace table also provides a calming space for children, as they learn to reflect, listen, and use the tools for a peaceful conflict resolution. If you would like to learn more about The Peace Table, please check out the book, The Peace Table by Mary Da Prato.
